

DEDJOCK CHIROCK CHASE. COMMUNICY FIRST INSUPPORTED VEHICLE

Dear Councillors,

Last May with the very generous assistance of a number of county and parish councillors we were able to purchase a Community First Responder vehicle for attending 999 calls in the Burntwood and Cannock areas. This vehicle is now the busiest volunteer led vehicle in the country. We respond on average to a call every 1 1/2 hours, this does not take into account the time we spend with patients which are usually between 30 minutes and an hour.

I've been working with the Foresty Commision at Birches Valley and also Staffordshire County Council at Marquis Drive to install public access defibrillators on Cannock Chase to provide lifesaving support in the event a member of the public suffers a cardiac arrest whilst in this remote location. You will all be familiar with the tragic incident on the Chase last October http://www.expressandstar.com/news/2014/10/28/girl-11-dies-after-cardiac-arrest-on-cannock-chase/

With footfall increasing due to bike trails, Grufallo Experience and concerts the next phase of providing coverage for this area is to launch another community responder vehicle. We have raised over £15,000 towards this by bag packing and charity fundraising, however now we now need your assistance.


We need a further £10,000 to purchase a vehicle, equip it with electrical, road safety and medical equipment. We continue to fundraise at supermarkets on at least a monthly basis however need the support of County Councillors through the Local Community Fund to have this vehicle on the road ASAP and responding to emergencies across Cannock Chase.

I appreciate whatever support you can give and I'm happy to come and talk to you more about the scheme and the plans should you wish to learn more.

The HTFCSA has a total membership of 85 as of November 2015 while on average we have an average home crowd of 470 in the current season. Of these a high proportion will be Hednesfrod residents.

As we look to improve the supporter experience when they visit Keys Park, the home of Hednesford Town Football Club, we are looking to improve the lighting both around the ground and also on the approach to the stadium through the award of a grant.
We are hoping to do this by installing new lighting in certain spectator areas of Keys Park in order to make it more welcoming and friendly for those using the ground. It will also help brighten up some areas which are at the moment dark due to them falling in an area where neither floodlights or existing light sources reach.
In three of our standing terraces, all of which have roofs to cover supporters, we are hoping to significantly improve the lighting which is now 20 years old. While better lighting outside of the ground will help provide an improved welcome and highlight the ground further to supporters.
With our support base having a high number of Hednesford residents included within it we feel that this will help improve their overall enjoyment of the facility and also provide them with a better match day atmosphere.

HTFCSA Treasurer's Report - up to 31st May 2015

A solid fourth period of operation for HTFCSA shows a <u>profit of £1,072.46</u> for period ending 31st May 2015.

Strong membership, continued quiz nights, income from coach travel and sponsorship by Carlsberg has generated a strong income for 2014/2015. HTFCSA has continued to support the club through providing baby changing facilities, web hosting and various other items that have supported the club.

The closing cash balance has increased by £1,072.46 to $\underline{\textbf{£4,021.40}}$ which is a healthy balance for an organisation of the HTFCSA's nature.

A summary of the last four years cash and profit can be seen below:

<u>Summary</u>

Since forming towards the end of 2010, HTFCSA have invested in a number of SA led initiatives. In this time, HTFCSA have supported the football club with the purchase a new club shop, organised re-union events for both the FA Cup and FA Trophy teams, sponsored players, advertised matches and put on additional travel to help many supporters attend some of the bigger games. Over the four year period, HTFCSA's cash balance has grown year on year which means despite these investments, HTFCSA continues to be profitable and manage its finances in a responsible manner.

In the previous year, HTFCSA has provided baby changing facilities to help improve facilities at Keys Park as well as providing funds for other supporter enhancing activities.

A significant part of HTFCSA is the Pitmen Prize draw. The financial position and incomings and outgoings are covered in the PPD report but I would like to highlight the significance PPD has had in the previous few years. The PPD has provided an ultrasound machine, defibrillator, training gear, fixes to the toilet block and tannoy amongst many other projects and it continues to be a success and behind HTFCSA's good financial management. PPD is having a significant impact on the success of the football club.

Moving forward and it is important that HTFCSA continue to generate a steady income and profit as we look to continue to meet the aims of HTFCSA and its members.

The key sources of income for 2014/5 will be:

- Membership renewals
- HTFCSA led events
- Advertising income (i.e. through HTFCSA TV)

HTFCSA Treasurer's Report - up to 31st May 2014

A solid third period of operation for HTFCSA shows a **<u>profit of £881.37</u>** for period ending 31st May 2014.

A change in focus to providing increased service to the members of HTFCSA has led to increased outgoings on events and travel, but has led to increased income and therefore profit from this approach.

The closing cash balance has increased by £881.37 to $\underline{\textbf{£2,948.94}}$ which I feel is a healthy balance for an organisation of our nature.

Summary

Since forming towards the end of 2010, HTFCSA have invested a total of £4,941.64 in HTFCSA led initiatives. In this time HTFCSA have supported the football club purchase a new club shop, organised re-union events for both the FA Cup and FA Trophy teams, sponsored players, advertised matches and put on additional travel helping many supporters attend some of the bigger games.

Over the three year period HTFCSA's cash balance has grown year on year which means despite this investment HTFCSA continues to be profitable and manages its finances in a responsible manner.

The PPD has provided a defibrillator, training gear, fixes to the toilet block and tannoy amongst many other projects and continues to be a success and behind HTFCSA's good financial management. I would urge all members to join PPD.

Current Position

Throughout 2012 and going in to 2013, HTFCSA have invested a total of £3,280.66 during that 18 month period. In this time the HTFCSA has continued to support not only the Football Club but also its members and other avenues as it continues to move forward off the field.

Club wise the HTFCSA made a substantial donation of £405 towards the purchase of a new Club Shop, something which HTFC had badly needed for a good period of time, whilst Player Sponsorship for the last two seasons also demonstrated our continued support. The various events which we held and supported saw as substantial outlay; however they returned good profits on the whole which also led to the HTFCSA donating £100 towards the running of the Travel Club in the process. Finally supporters

were also rewarded, with those that signed up to the HTFCSA by being supplied with a Membership Pack, whilst the continued funding of the HTFCSA and Official Club Website as well as advertising were also met.

During that same period nearly £2000 in income was received from the various events which we held. Meanwhile some £790 was raised in Membership Fees whilst a profit of £398.50 was invested from the running of coaches to AFC Fylde and the two Senior Cup Finals. The introduction of the successful Pitmen Prize Draw (PPD) has seen another form of steady income achieved with over £300 being donated to the HTFCSA with money being held in reserve for when it is required. There have also been other areas of income which are all detailed above.

Firstly, I would like to say how grateful we are for all of your support over the years; it really has made such a vital contribution towards our care services, so thank you. As discussed, please find below this year's application for support. Thank you for taking the time to consider it once again.

Katharine House is the only hospice serving an area in mid-Staffordshire of around 450 square miles centred on Stafford. We provide specialised palliative care services for anyone with an incurable illness, such as motor neurone disease, cancer, or multiple sclerosis. Support is not only available to patients but also to those close to them. All our services are free and open to everyone and include: inpatient care, day therapies, lymphoedema treatment, bereavement support and a rapid response at home service for people who wish to die at home. Currently one in five people dying in the Stafford district will receive care from Katharine House Hospice. We help our patients to feel independent, valued, free from pain and other symptoms, and that they are truly living rather than just waiting to die.

We treat adults of all ages. Our patients include an increasing number of young people, who are living longer, thanks to advances in medical knowledge and technology, and so need to transfer from childrens' hospices to our care. We also look after people in their middle years, but most of our patients are older people.

Over the past four years we have seen a steady increase in the number of people we have supported which, we predict, will continue to increase. In 2012 we supported 863 patients, 890 in 2013, 1,000 in 2014 and in 2015 we expect this to increase again. As a result we are working hard to maintain and extend our income. This is particularly challenging in the current economic climate.

All our services are of great public benefit, yet we struggle to raise our ever-increasing running costs which currently stand at £2.7million.

We use a range of fund-raising methods to raise the cost of all our overheads, and ask grant-makers like yourselves to help with the direct costs of caring for our patients and their carers. We are proud to say that 84% of all donations are spent directly on patient care.

The directors present their report and the unaudited financial statements of the company for the year ended 30 April 2015.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES AND BUSINESS REVIEW

MASE, Monthly Alzheimer's Support Evening, is an independent charity working to support people affected by Alzheimer's/Dementia and their Carers. The Groups have developed a service that is becoming very popular, this is evidenced by the numbers attending increasing at all of the groups.

There are no paid personnel in the MASE, the groups are run by the Trustees and our valuable Volunteers. We are delighted to have recently attracted younger volunteers to the group and this year we also have someone who is working towards her Duke of Edinburgh Award, and has chosen to join us as a volunteer.

This financial year we were approached to launch a new Group in Hednesford, which has become a Dementia Friendly Town. The new MASE group opened its doors in October 2014 and we are pleased to announce numbers attending have steadily risen since then and we are getting more new people attending each month.

The MASE continues to operate in a funding climate that is difficult and which is likely to get tougher. Major reductions in public expenditure and the increase in competition, all mean that the process of getting funding and avoiding a 'hand-to-mouth' existence is tough.

Trustees and volunteers regularly fundraise to ensure we have funds to guarantee the groups have longevity. Sadly, although not core-funded, our groups have over 400 people attending each month. We have built up a good professional reputation and offer a service giving Carers and their cared for an evening where they can relax and enjoy themselves, whilst networking with others in a similar situation. We do not charge people to attend the groups, our reason for this is to enable people, who perhaps have financial difficulties, to be able to attend the groups and therefore avoid the risk of social isolation. We are confident the service we offer does work and most definitely makes a difference to the people attending each month.

FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS

In 2015 we will be opening a MASE group in Stafford at a new Community Hub, The Northfield Centre. Having researched the area, we established there are no other evening groups for people with Alzheimer's/Dementia.

After much consideration, the Trustees have with heavy hearts made the decision to close the Great Wyrley Group, our last meeting will take place on 6 July 2015. This has not been an easy decision to make, and we are incredibly proud of things we have achieved over the five years we have been in Great Wyrley. However, sometimes difficult decisions do have to be made. As a compromise we have offered transport to the people of Great Wyrley to enable them to attend the Hednesford Group should they so so wish to do so.

We continue to pride ourselves on maintaining a high and professional standard at all of the groups. Our goal is to ensure Carers and cared for who are on the pathway with Alzheimer's/ Dementia continue to get the valuable support they need by way of social interaction.

MASE is a local Charity supporting local people and we are proud to say that for as long as we possibly can 'we will strive to continually make a difference to the families who are on the journey of Dementia'.

Staffordshire Women's Aid is a charitable and voluntary organisation that has been providing services for women and children living with, fleeing or recovering from the impact of domestic and sexual violence since 1976. We aim to support and empower women and children towards safer, more independent lives, free from violence and abuse.

Our Services include:

- A 24 Hour Helpline
- Safe Refuge Accommodation
- Extensive Community Outreach Service
- Children and Young People's Support Service
- The SURVIVE Sexual Violence Service

Nearly 40 years on, we remain a grass roots, user-led organisation, placing at the heart of our work the views of the women and children we work with.

In October, we are very excited to be opening a new refuge in Stafford, *Forward House*, to replace our existing, out dated, communal refuge. The new refuge will include 12 self-contained flats, a large children's playroom and outdoor play area, a teenagers room and a group activity room. It will provide safe accommodation for women and children across Staffordshire who need to flee their homes because of domestic violence. Within the refuge, we will provide practical and emotional support, and work to re-build the confidence and self-esteem which so many women and children lose because of domestic violence. We will also provide children with a safe space where they can voice their feelings and experiences around the traumas they have been through. The refuge will provide high quality accommodation and support to vulnerable families who both need and deserve it. It is likely that we will support over 100 families a year in the refuge, and at any one time we will be able to accommodate up to 12 women and 34 children.

We are writing to you because as a charity, we now have the task of raising £80,000 to equip and furnish the refuge flats and communal areas. We hope Hednesford Town Parish Council will consider supporting us in any way possible, either by making a donation or raising funds on our behalf.

Should you feel able to support us, there are a number of possible options in terms of an amount. We have calculated that:

- To fully equip one 2 bedroom flat would cost £4,600
- To equip one room would cost approximately £1,000
- To enable us to purchase a fridge and freezer would cost £250
- Bedding for one family would cost £125
- Basic kitchen equipment would cost around £50
- Towels for one family would cost £50

All donations, no matter how big or small, will make a huge difference to our fundraising appeal and the support we are able to provide to women and children fleeing domestic violence.

When we have set up the refuge, we will (with their permission) acknowledge those supporters who have helped by inscribing their names on a plaque to be displayed in the refuge. We will do this because we think it is vital that the women and children we work with know they are not isolated and alone, and are aware that others in the local community support our work and care about them.

We do hope that you will consider helping us in setting up the new refuge in Stafford. Unfortunately many women and children still live in fear, and are not safe even in their own homes. Research from the British Crime Survey shows that each week 2 women are killed in the UK through domestic violence. Furthermore, where domestic violence is taking place, there is a 50% likelihood that child abuse is also taking place (NSPCC research). Last year we took over 3,500 calls on our 24 hour helpline, accommodated 37 women and 56 children in our refuge, and worked with 728 adults and 139 children through our holistic range of community outreach services. Our work is vital in supporting these vulnerable women and children in our communities, and we hope that you will be part of it.
